## A Note from the Nurse

We at Caprock Academy will comply with the CDC guidelines for H1N1 (aka Swine Flu) prevention in the school. Therefore we have the following guidelines: Any student with a fever of 100 degrees and complaining of flu-like symptoms must be isolated until a parent can pick them up from school. Any staff person with a fever of 100 degrees and complaining of flu-like symptoms must go home.

Flu-like symptoms include any to all of the following: sore throat, cough, body aches, general malaise, diarrhea, and vomiting.

Parents must come and pick up their kids if they have a temperature of 100 degrees and flu-like symptoms. All students and staff who have been home with a fever of 100 degrees and flu-like symptoms must be free of fever for 24 hours, without any type of fever reducing medications, before they can return to school or work.

## After School Programs

Teachers, staff and qualified volunteers of Caprock Academy are offering an after school class for various components of Literacy, Math and Study Skills. Classes will start promptly at 3:15 and stop at 4:15. These classes are teacher recommended only and will focus on providing further instruction. Homework from their regular class will need to be completed outside of these classes. The school will provide snacks and a teacher who has a specific focus in a fun, safe environment. The classroom teacher will bring the students out to the sidewalk for regular pick-up procedure. Please be respectful of the pick-up time since the teachers are volunteering their time for this class.
